ADMINISTRATOR SUPERVISION

Each school should have an administrator or designee on site to supervise and assist with crowd control. Please enter the names of the supervisors on the tournament information pages located on the WCD website. The names of the supervisors will be placed on a pass list. Only those supervisors, whose names appear on the pass list, will be allowed free entry. Once on site, the head supervisor should check in with the tournament manager.

SEATING

Home school will sit in the <u>North</u> half (to the left of entrance) of the grandstands (farthest from entrance. Visiting School will sit in <u>South</u> half (to the left) of the grandstands (nearest to the entrance).

RESTROOMS

Restrooms are located on the South end Grandstand. Locker rooms are for team use only. There are no public restrooms available in the locker rooms.

BAND SEATING

The home team band shall share the home school section The visiting team band shall share the visiting school section

SIDELINES & TEAM BENCH

Both team benches will be placed on the <u>SAME</u> sideline (East side of the stadium) and on the TRACK Surface. <u>All</u> Fans are restricted to the West Grandstand. Benches are separated by 10 yards and off the turf.

Home Team (bottom team on bracket) will warm up on the North end of the field and occupy the North BENCH. Visiting Team (top team on bracket) will warm up on the South end and occupy the South BENCH.

NO SEEDS OR FOOD OF ANY KIND ALLOWED ON THE TURF. SCHOOLS VIOLATING THIS RULE WILL BE BILLED FOR CLEANUP COSTS.

SIGNS & SCHOOL BANNERS

NO signs other than the OFFICIAL SCHOOL BANNER will be allowed. Please inform your crowd.

LOCKER ROOMS

HOME SCHOOL will use the West Grandstand locker room. VISITORS will use the East Grandstand locker room.

GAME JERSEYS

HOME SCHOOL will wear LIGHT COLORED JERSEYS VISITING SCHOOL will wear DARK COLORED JERSEYS

MEDICAL

The tournament medical authority will be a Certified Athletic Trainer from ATI PT on duty for each game. If a team will have a team physician and/or athletic trainer in attendance, please notify the tournament manager. The tournament medical authority will make the final determination regarding return to play.

PRE-GAME SCHEDULE

Pre-game warm up will be a minimum of 15 minutes* (Horn sounds at 00:00). If time allows, teams will be given up to 20 minutes of pre-match warm up time. The following time schedule will be kept, using the stadium scoreboard clock:

- Five minutes remaining (00:00 on clock*) teams line up at their respective team benches
- Four minutes remaining INTERNATIONAL WALKOUT to the far side hash marks (introduction of officials)
- Three minutes remaining Team introductions, as follows:
 - + Visiting team reserves, starters, and coaches
 - + Home team reserves, starters, and coaches
- Two minutes remaining Teams turn to face the American flag on the North end of the field. The National Anthem will be sung or played before each match.
- One minute remaining teams face each other and advance to midfield to shake hands before returning to their bench

*Note: The stadium scoreboard clock will be set to allow for introductions prior to kick-off

GAMES COMMITTEE

The Games Committee will include the following:

- WIAA Officials Liaison TBD
- WIAA Representative (If Present/by phone)

The Games Committee, composed of a least three of the individuals listed above, will hear and decide on any protest and/or appeal.

AWARDS

Participation Certificates

All participants in the WCD tournament will receive participation certificates. These certificates will be sent to the school by the WCD.

BALLS

The Tournament Manager will furnish the official tournament **Spalding TF-5000 Size 5** soccer ball for warm-up and match play.

BRACKETS

The soccer tournament brackets are available on the WCD website.

<u>CLOCK</u>

The official time will be kept on the field by the center official. The stadium clock is unofficial.

NATIONAL ANTHEM

The National Anthem will be played prior to each game as part of the team introductions.

CROWD CONTROL

Security and site supervisors will be provided. Crowd control is the responsibility of the participating school supervisors. It is important that building administrators provide game supervision in the stands by promoting a safe enjoyable event for everyone. Please remind students to wear shirts, to observe the stadium policy of no body or face paint, no masks, and to observe the WIAA Tournament policy. If an issue with one of your students arises we will ask you to address it.

FAN AND STUDENT SPECTATORS

The tournament manager will assign each participating school a rooting section. The supervision of this section will be the responsibility of the school. Spectators are not allowed on the playing field at any time, and are required to stay behind the fenced areas at all times.

BALL HOLDERS

The site manager may provide ball holders behind each goal. Alternate soccer balls will be placed at strategic locations on the sidelines and goal areas.

HALF TIME INTERMISSION

The half time intermission shall be 10 minutes long beginning immediately after first half ends.

LODGING

A listing of motels is available on request.

MATCH RULES

FIFA RULES will be used in all State playoff games with WIAA published exceptions.

The method of breaking ties will be as follows:

Two (2) golden goal (5) minute overtimes. A coin toss shall be held prior to the first overtime as per Law 8. At the end of the first overtime period, teams shall change ends. If still tied at the end of the second overtime, penalty kicks will decide the outcome. The head referee shall choose the goal at which all of the kicks from the penalty mark shall be taken. Each coach will select five (5) players, including the goalkeeper, only players who are <u>on the</u> <u>field</u> of play at the end of the match are eligible take the kicks. A coin toss shall be held with the winning team having choice of kicking first or second. Teams will alternate kickers. There is no follow up on the kick. The defending team may change goalkeepers with an eligible player prior to each penalty kick. Following the five (5) kicks, the team scoring on the greatest number of kicks shall be declared the winner. If the score remains tied, each coach shall select five (5) different players than the first five to take kicks until one team has scored a goal more than the other from the same number of kicks.

OFFICIALS

Four (3) WOA certified soccer officials will be assigned to each match. Officials are selected by their association to work at this tournament and are assigned by the WCD. The officials will be head referee and two assistant referees. Official assessors may also be assigned. The assessor will provide the WIAA with an independent evaluation of the tournament as a WIAA event.

DUTIES OF SCHOOL SUPERVISORS

- Report to the tournament manager at least 45 minutes prior to their team's first match.
- Must wear supervisor identification so that it is visible and easily seen.
- Sit with your school's student body and fans while your team is competing.
- Be active and visible in the cheering section with your student body and fans during all contests in order to discourage problems

- Be willing to approach students and/or community representatives who display inappropriate behavior.
- Notify tournament staff of potential problem individuals.
- Be of assistance as requested by facility security staff or tournament management staff.
- Be sure aisles and stairways are kept clear in the stands.
- Keep your students and fans from entering the playing surface.
- Assist in the orderly flow of traffic of fans entering and exiting the facility.
- At the conclusion of your game, assist your school's students and fans in leaving the bleachers.
- Foster the traits of good sportsmanship.

RADIO AND TELEVISION COVERAGE

Stations wishing to broadcast or televise the match must have the prior approval of the WCD.

SQUAD / SIDELINE SIZE STRICTLY ENFORCED

22 Players6 Designated school personnel2 Supervisors (Names on the pass list)

OFFICIAL SCORER

The official scorer will verify each team's complete lineup, record all scores, record the number and reason for all players cautioned and disqualified, and will obtain the head referee's verification of a score.

VIDEO TAPING/FILMING

All filming will be done from the spectator seating area. No special arrangements will be provided to schools.
