**D. ACCEPTABLE PASSES (all passes must be current) - No other passes accepted; ID required**

- District 1 Supervisory Passes (Orange)  
(People using these **WILL** be expected to supervise students.)
- State Coaches and Athletic Directors Passes (WSCA & WSSAAA)-
- WOA State Observer passes (Officials Association)
- NW District and WIAA Lifetime Passes

E. **SUPERVISOR AND STUDENT PARTICIPANT ENTRY**

1. Pass lists personnel will be entered on the team roster along with the coaches and athletes. It is strongly recommended that supervisors use a District One pass. Support personnel (up to 8 including coaches, managers, statisticians, trainers, etc.) will be entered on the pass list.
2. Cheerleaders in uniform (of those teams involved in tournament) will be admitted free.
3. Participants whose names appear on the post season game roster (players/coaches, etc.) **that is posted on the WPA website**, may be admitted to games for their respective tournament (boys/girls). Girls only at Shorewood and Mariner and boys only at Jackson High School. Boys and girls tournament participants may enter the games for free at Everett Community College on February 22 by reporting to the pass gate.

F. **OFFICIALS**

The Northwest District One Board will assign officials by allocations from the Association and Boards serving the DISTRICT 1 3A schools.

G. **PROTESTS**

Any disputes occurring at the tournament will be presented to the Tournament Manager, which will confer with the tournament committee. Their decision will be final.

H. **TOURNAMENT PROCEDURE INFORMATION**

1. Dressing Rooms: Each school will be assigned to a dressing room area. Signs will be posted on the dressing room door assigned to your participants. **BE SURE:**
  - a. Participants deposit all debris in the waste cans
  - b. P.E. baskets and contents are not disturbed
  - c. Bulletin boards are left untouched
  - d. Each coach will discuss the proper care of locker rooms and shower rooms with the team.
  - e. Each school or participant must furnish his or her own towels.
  - f. Valuables should not be left in the dressing rooms.
2. Facilities:
  - a. Each team will be given a locker room for changing.
  - b. A meeting room will be provided for each team. It will include seating and white board for team use. This room may be different than the locker room.
  - c. Auxiliary gyms will NOT be available for warm-up at any tournament location throughout the tournament.
  - d. Each tournament site manager is responsible for providing a safe environment. The tournament manager at each facility will determine whether or not additional police or security personnel are necessary. School administrators should advise each site manager as to whether their community/students are particularly challenging and necessitate additional security
3. Floor: Will be available 20 minutes prior to the first game of a double header. Second games will get 20 minutes following the previous contest. The timer will sound the horn to indicate when teams may take the floor to start warming up. **No shoot around during halftime of any contest.** Please remind your athletes that street shoes should not be worn on the playing surface at any time.
4. Game Jersey Regulations: White jerseys will be worn by the home team. The home team will be the higher seed or the team with the better tie-breaker number if seeds are the same.
5. Players Bench: Twelve (12) players, head coach, assistant coaches and two managers only will be allowed on the bench. **A total of 16 chairs will be available for the team bench.** Please cooperate with the N.W. District Policy.
6. Basketball: The Home team on the bracket will provide the game ball for ALL tournament games.

7. Officials Table: No one will be allowed at the official's table except the TIMEKEEPER, OFFICIAL SCOREKEEPER AND ANNOUNCER. A separate area will be available for school scorers and statisticians.
8. Band & Half Time Entertainment:
  - a. Schools who desire to bring a band must contact the tournament director at each location and make definite arrangements. For games at Home Sites, contact the athletic director of the host school at least one day prior to the game to determine if there is capacity for the visiting band. At tournament sites, preference will be given to the school that makes the first contact, in the event of a sellout. However, space permitting, each team will be allowed to bring their band. **If bringing a full set of drums, you must bring a mat to protect the floor surface. Please remember to notify the tournament manager.**
  - b. Each band is to limit their number to fifty (50) or less. Additional band members may be allowed but the school may be required to pay for any over 50 members.
  - c. The home team band will play the National Anthem before the first game of the evening.
9. Student/Fan rooting sections:

**\*\*\*SPECIAL NOTICE TO PRINCIPALS AND ATHLETIC DIRECTORS\*\*\***

Space will be reserved for students of participating schools. Schools involved are expected to send personnel to supervise their reserved section in the seating areas. Supervisors report to the Tournament Manager. Supervisors will be admitted only if their name is on the PASS LIST or if they have an approved pass.

  - a. Artificial noisemakers and the throwing of confetti are prohibited. We discourage the use of face paint and spirit symbols. (Foam #1 hands)
  - b. GOOD SPORTSMANSHIP MUST BE A PRIORITY.
10. Parking Facilities: Parking is available in the student parking lots at each high school. Parking space is limited; spectators are encouraged to carpool.
11. Student Reporters & Photographers: One photographer and one reporter per school will be allowed. However, they must be identified by a letter from their school and the floor privileges cleared through the tournament manager.

I. **ALL ROSTERS MUST BE UPLOADED ONTO THE WPA WEBSITE.**

- Be sure to update your rosters to include only Varsity/District Tournament players. Delete all JV/C rosters.
- Participant admission will be by rosters submitted on the website.
- Changes to the district tournament roster MAY be made between each round of competition during the tournament.
